The Orchestra was preceded by the Morgan State Choir who put on a hand-clapping, foot-stomping show before giving way to the Phabulous Philadelphians who performed Beethoven's majestic Ninth Symphony, sometimes called the Ode to Joy, based on a poem by Friedrich Schiller. We do these activities annually as the Mann Center is the summer home of the Orchestra.
