He would camp, hike, kayak, dirt bike, ski, and who knows what else? I am told he even had a black belt in Judo. For Gosh Sakes he jumped out of an airplane with 19 others for his 70<sup>th</sup> birth-day. Who does that?

More importantly he looked out for everyone. When skiing, he liked to be the trailer who picked people up when they fell. When rollerblading in the Fall, he would often show up and put the tailgate down in the back of the truck to reveal hot soup for everyone. For the Atco to Margate bike ride he would be the trailer car. For the camping crew he was known for his campfires (among other things).

Looking at the comments on Facebook there were many repeated phrases of him being a kind gentleman, he had a forever smile, he had a passion for life and we were lucky to have known him and a good friend.

Thank you to his family, Jane, David and Jack for letting him be away from you all those times so he could be with us. He did speak lovingly of all of you. His final years in Assisted Living must have been torture for all of you who was so used to him living his 92 years of life to the fullest.

May we all raise a toast to the Crazy Old Man who made the world a better place with him being in it. May we all have his zest for life.

prime rib with horseradish sauce and crispy onions on toasted Brioche (\$11.25). How could you go wrong?





The book for the month of Feb. 2024 will be: In The Garden of Beasts by Erik Larson

Erik Larson, New York Times bestselling author of Devil in the White City, delivers a remarkable story set during Hitler's rise to power. The time is 1933, the place, Berlin, when William E. Dodd becomes America's first ambassador to Hitler's Nazi Germany in a year that proved to be a turning point in history.

A mild-mannered professor from Chicago, Dodd brings along his wife, son, and flamboyant daughter, Martha. At first Martha is entranced by the parties and pomp, and the handsome voung men of the Third Reich with their infectious enthusiasm for restoring Germany to a position of world prominence. Enamored of the "New Germany," she has one affair after another, including with the suprisingly honorable first chief of the Gestapo, Rudolf Diels. But as evidence of Jewish persecution mounts, confirmed by chilling first-person testimony, her father telegraphs his concerns to a largely indifferent State Department back home. Dodd watches with alarm as Jews are attacked, the press is censored, and drafts of frightening new laws begin to circulate. As that first year unfolds and the shadows deepen, the Dodds experience days full of excitement, intrique, romance—and ultimately, horror, when a climactic spasm of violence and murder reveals Hitler's true character and ruthless ambition.

Suffused with the tense atmosphere of the period, and with unforgettable portraits of the bizarre Göring and the expectedly charming--yet wholly sinister--Goebbels, *In the Garden of Beasts* lends a stunning, eyewitness perspective on events as they unfold in real time, revealing an era of surprising nuance and com-



plexity. The result is a dazzling, addictively readable work that speaks volumes about why the world did not recognize the grave threat posed by Hitler until Berlin, and Europe, were awash in blood and terror.
